

Childrens Surgical Centre, Childrens Surgical Center (USA Overseas), and Cambodian Acid Survivors Charity are each governed by an overlapping board of directors, but each board of directors governs independently. None of these three entities is subordinate to each other, nor to any other organization. There are shared interests among the three organizations. These are: providing charitable medical care to people with disabilities in underdeveloped countries; training to build local capabilities; primary focus on the needs of children and on Cambodia, but primary focus does not preclude serving the people in need other than children or assisting underdeveloped countries other than Cambodia. The organizations are independent of any government and religious organizations. The three organizations do work selectively and synergistically with government organizations (including educational, medical, military providing humanitarian aid, embassies, aid agencies) and religious organizations (including different faiths) when there are opportunities to leverage effectiveness.

Each of the boards of directors controls the use of funds donated to the three respective organizations. The organizations may solicit funds to grant to other organizations (examples are Childrens Surgical Center USA Overseas raising funds for Childrens Surgical Centre, Cambodian Acid Survivors Charity, Sunrise Children's Village, CamKids, Stop Exploitation Now, and others in the future). The organizations may make grants to other organizations without having raised funds specifically for the other organizations (examples are a Rotary International project in El Salvador and Kossamak Hospital in Cambodia). In all cases the boards of directors perform due-diligence, ensuring that grants are used for charitable purposes, accounted for, transparent for inspection, and that donations designated for a restricted use (examples: Childrens Surgical Centre; Sunrise Children's Village; CamKids) are granted specifically to those beneficiaries.

Unrestricted donations are the greatest need of Childrens Surgical Centre, Childrens Surgical Center (USA Overseas), and Cambodian Acid Survivors Charity. That is, in addition to specific restricted use projects, funds are most needed for day to day functioning. The organizations have very tight control of day to day costs.
